FIRST READING: Isaiah 45:21-25

For I am God, and there is no other. 23By myself I have sworn, from my mouth has gone forth in righteousness a word that shall not return: ‘To me every knee shall bow, every tongue shall swear.’ 24“Only in the Lord, it shall be said of me, are righteousness and strength; all who were incensed against him. shall come to him and be ashamed. 25In the Lord all the offspring of Israel shall triumph and glory.”







Holy and gracious Father: In your infinite love you made us for yourself; and, when we had fallen into sin and become subject to evil and death, you, in your mercy, sent Jesus Christ, your only and eternal Son, to share our human nature, to live and die as one of us, to reconcile us to you, the God and Father of all.


